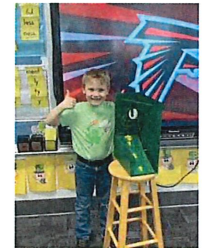
Donation: John Glenn Educational Foundation donated \$1,000 from the Gala for innovative ideas for the school.

The Urey Student Council will be selling Yuda Bands after Spring Break as a service project. Yuda Bands:

1. **Provide Education for students** - Each Yuda Band sold contributes to scholarships to pay school fees for high school students in a developing country.
2. **Create Jobs** - Local Guatemalan artisans are given fair-trade wages to hand-make Yuda Bands out of leather and coconut shells.
3. **Global Awareness** - The Yuda Bands project promotes awareness of international issues in schools
4. We get to meet and talk with the international student we provide funds for - Yuda Bands is a totally unique service learning project that allows students and teachers in the US to connect with the international student they are supporting.

Each band costs \$10. The goal is to sell 200 bands so we have an opportunity to raise \$2000 to help educate students and create jobs. What we don't use we are able to ship back without any charge.

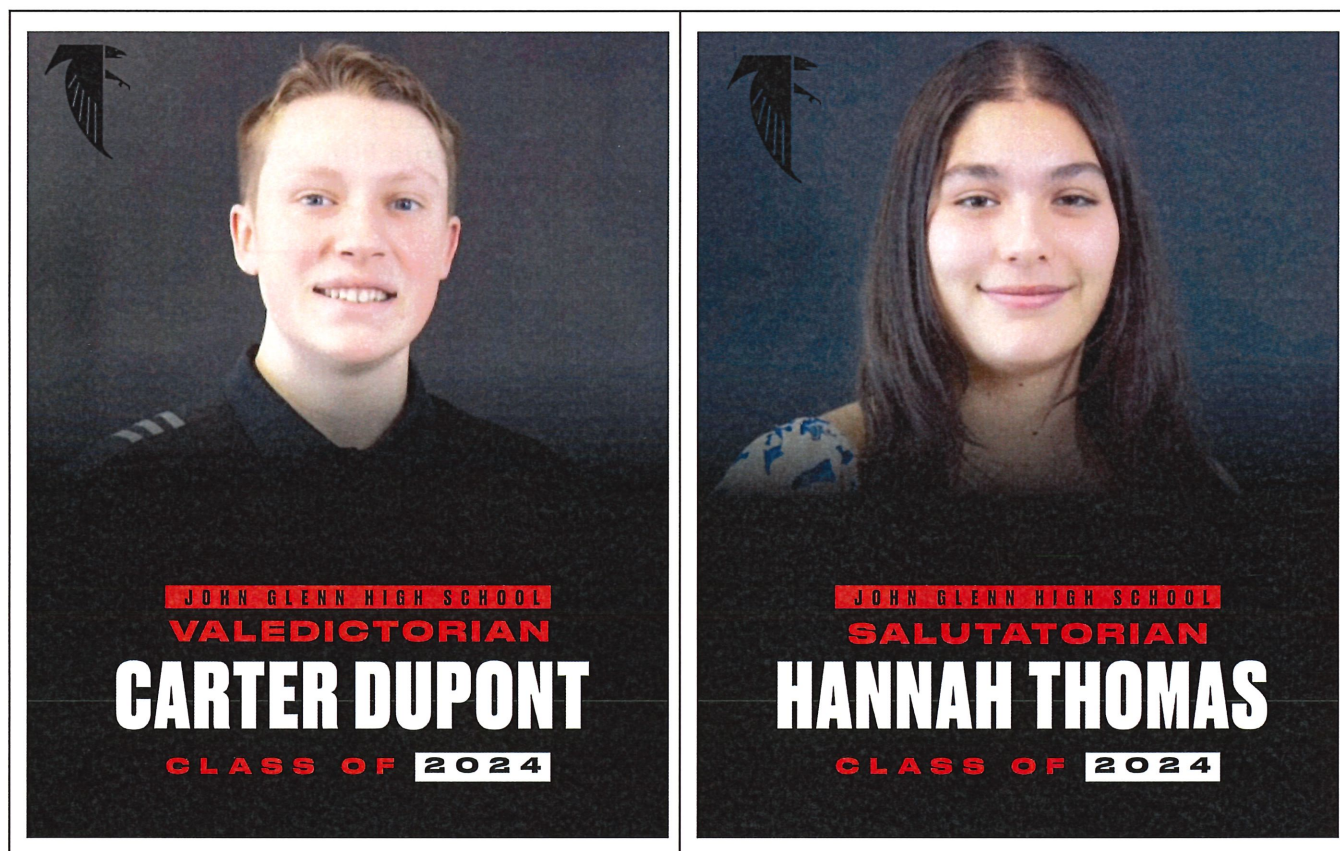
2024 Valedictorian and Salutatorian
