School Board Meeting – June 6, 2017 Regular Session

CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL - 7:00 P.M.

ESTABLISH A QUORUM AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The Board of School Trustees of the John Glenn School Corporation met in regular session at 7:00 p.m. on June 6, 2017, at the John Glenn Administration Building. Board members present were Jeff Johnson, Christian Mattix, Janice Ryan, Dennis Holland, Curt Pletcher, Bill Groves, and Bob Borlik. Richard Reese, Superintendent, and six observers were present.

RECOGNITIONS (WES, NLES, UMS, JGHS)

Mr. Tim Davis, Walkerton Elementary Principal, presented to the Board a list of the fourth nine-weeks and second semester honor rolls. Mr. Davis then announced WES had 33 students with perfect attendance for the 2016-2017 school year. Each of these students received a t-shirt, which reflects their perfect attendance accomplishment. Next, Mr. Davis thanked Mrs. Raquel Snyder for organizing the WES Field Day on Tuesday, May 30, 2017. Mr. Davis noted that 33 Presidential Awards were given to students in Sixth Grade,six Gold Awards were given to students who made the Distinguished Honor Roll at least three times this year; and 27 Silver awards were given to students who made the Honor roll at least one time this year. Mr. Davis noted how proud he is of these students.

1. Approve NLES, WES, and UMS Athletic 2017-2018 Handbook

Mr. Mark Maudlin, Urey Middle School Principal, submitted the Elementary and Middle School Athletic Handbook for approval by the Board. Bill Groves made a motion to approve the NLES, WES, and UMS 2017-18 Athletic Handbook. Janice Ryan seconded the motion, and the motion passed with a vote of seven to zero.

2. Approve Proposed Curriculum and/or Pacing Guides for UMS Math, Health, LA, and Science

Mr. Maudlin provided information to the Board concerning proposed curriculum and/or pacing guides for middle school Math, Health, Language Arts, and Science classes. A short discussion was held before

Mr. Maudlin submitted a request for the purchase of Language Arts textbooks from Houghton Mifflin Harcourt for \$36,741.48, Math textbooks from Pearson for \$26,585.48, Science textbooks from Discovery Education for \$16,800, and Health textbooks from McGraw Hill for \$16,565.47. The total expenditure for all four areas of textbooks is \$96,692.43. Bill Groves made a motion to approve the purchase of digital and/or print textbooks for Urey Middle School at the total price of \$96,692.43. Christian Mattix seconded the motion, and the motion passed with a vote of seven to zero.

5. IRead 3 Results Presentation – Rebecca Cummings

Mrs. Rebecca Cummings presented information to the Board concerning the recent iRead 3 test results. Mrs. Cummings noted that 81% of students at North Liberty Elementary passed the test, while 89% of Walkerton Elementary students passed. Mrs. Cummings stated that any students who did not pass the test will have the opportunity to attend summer school and re-take the test before the beginning of the 2017-18 school year.

Mr. Reese informed board members that the Building Trades Program will be receiving a new equipment trailer through the vocational program. Mr. Reese noted that the corporation must pay the upfront costs of the trailer, then will be reimbursed through the vocational co-op.
