College Application Deadlines: Please check college/university website for Specific Application Deadlines. Please note, certain colleges/majors/departments within a school may also have separate deadlines.

Early Action Application Deadlines: Can include but are not limited to Priority Fall Enrollment, Merit Scholarships, Competitive Majors, & Honors College.

Rolling Admissions: Colleges evaluate applications as they are received versus waiting to evaluate all applications after a hard deadline. Schools will continue to evaluate applications until they've filled all the slots for their incoming class.

Open Admissions: Typically have few admission thresholds and will admit all applicants so long as certain minimum requirements are met. New admission is often granted continually throughout the year.

Early Decision: Early decision is binding. This means if you are accepted through early decision, you are committed to attending that school, and will withdraw any applications you may have submitted for the regular deadlines at other schools. You may not apply to more than one college under early decision. If you are not accepted, you will either be rejected or deferred. Rejected applicants may not apply again that year. Deferred applicants will be reconsidered during the regular admission period, and are free to apply to other schools.

Early Action: Early action is non-binding. This means you are not bound to attend if you are accepted. You may also apply early action to multiple colleges.

Test-Optional= Allows you to choose whether to have your SAT or ACT test scores considered as part of your application review—letting you decide how best to tell your academic story. Research indicates that for most students, high school GPA paired with test scores provides the best prediction of academic success. However, for some students a standardized test score may not show all that they are capable of or tell the full story of their potential.

Test-Flexible= This means that if a student can take an SAT or ACT, it is preferred they do so. However, we recognize that possible cancellations and postponement of national standardized tests due to pandemic restrictions may be impacting students' applications. With that in mind, we will move forward and review any application from a student who is unable to take a standardized test.
