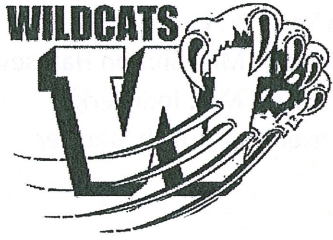

 - With that being said, WES is very proud of our students and all of the work they have put in.



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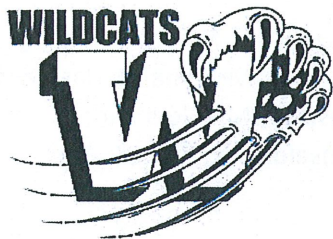
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- WES STEAM Museum

Miss Lile's 7th grade Advanced Math classes are playing Rock, Paper, Scissors and Dice games as a way to understand experimental probability.

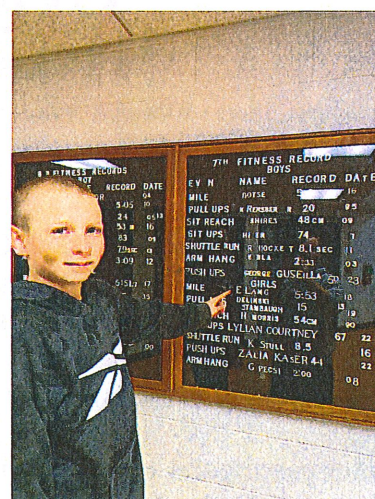
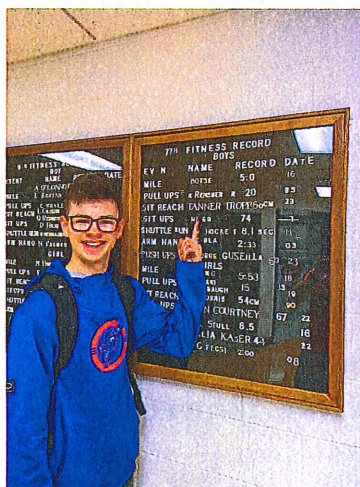


Congratulations to Lydia Goodsell for setting 3 school track records at the meet against LaPorte on April 19th.

She then broke her own Long Jump record against Triton with a jump of 17ft 9 ¼ in and broke the school record in the 400M Dash with a time of 1:02.97.

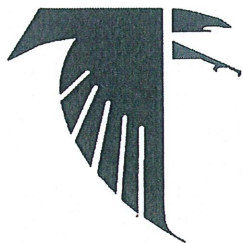
Congratulations to Tanner Tropp for breaking the Boy's Sit and Reach record with a stretch of 50cm!
