School Board Meeting – May 7, 2019 Regular Session

CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL – 7:00 P.M.

ESTABLISH A QUORUM AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The Board of School Trustees of the John Glenn School Corporation met in regular session at 7:00 p.m. on May 7, 2019, at the John Glenn Administration Office. Board members present were Jeff Johnson, Bob Borlik, Christian Mattix, Dennis Holland, Curt Pletcher, and Dan Drotar. Bill Groves was absent. Richard Reese, Superintendent, and eight observers were also present.

RECOGNITIONS (WES, NLES, UMS, JGHS)

Walkerton Elementary Recognitions:

The following donation was received:

- Mr. Davis invited board members and Superintendent Reese to Walkerton Elementary School's Spring Fling on Friday, May 10th from 5:30 to 7:00 p.m.
- Sixth grade students Dannie Divine, Briana Wolff, Daelynn Nance, and Mia Hurford competed in the Stanley Clark Golf Tournament on Saturday May 4th and brought home the First Place trophy.

NEW BUSINESS

1. Approve Six-Semester Graduate

Mr. Manering presented Cheyenne Humphrey to the School Board. Miss Humphrey requested to graduate June, 2019, as a six-semester graduate. Christian Mattix made a motion to approve Cheyenne Humphrey's request for a six-semester graduation upon completion of required credits. Bob Borlik seconded the motion, and the motion passed with a six to zero vote.

2. Approve Overnight Trip for Falcon Pride Marching Band to Indianapolis, IN on May 25, 2019

Mr. Nathanael Sudduth requested permission to take the Falcon Pride to Indianapolis to perform at the Indianapolis 500 Pre-Race Parade of Bands on May 26, 2019. As the parade starts at 8:00 a.m., Mr. Sudduth would like to take the students down Saturday night so they will be rested for their Sunday morning performance. Jeff Johnson made a motion to approve the Falcon Pride overnight trip to Indianapolis on May 25, 2019. Christian Mattix seconded the motion, and the motion passed with a vote of six to zero.

3. Approve Overnight Trip for FFA Students to West Lafayette, IN on May 17, 2019

Mr. Larry McCollough requested permission for four students to travel with an adult chaperone, Mrs. Jennifer Toth (also a JGSC bus driver), to compete at the State Livestock Judging contest at Purdue University on May 18, 2019. Christian Mattix made a motion to approve the FFA overnight trip to West Lafayette, Indiana on May 17, 2019. Curt Pletcher seconded the motion, and the motion passed with a vote of six to zero.

4. Approve Purchase of Servers and Services from Matrix Technologies for \$65,396.

Mr. Andy Stegemiller asked to purchase a Virtual Datacenter Upgrade from Matrix Technologies for \$66,396. Mr. Stegemiller obtained three quotes from vendors, with Matrix coming in at the lowest cost. After Mr. Stegemiller answered questions from the Board, Christian Mattix made a motion to approve the Virtual Datacenter Upgrade purchase from Matrix Technologies for \$65,396. Curt Pletcher seconded the motion, and the motion passed with a vote of six to zero.

5. Approve Dietician Contract between NIESC, JGSC, and Kaylyn MacKillop

This contract has been a yearly request for approximately ten years. The Dietician services are shared among other school corporations, and John Glenn pays \$3,500 towards the Dietician's salary. Jeff Johnson made a motion to approve the Dietician contract for \$3,500. Christian Mattix seconded the motion, and the motion passed with a vote of six to zero.

6. Approve Resolution to Purchase (75) \$30 Gift Cards for \$2,250 to honor JGHS Staff for earning 4-Star Status

Mr. Reese reported that John Glenn High School has earned Four-Star Status with the Indiana Department of Education for the 2017-18 school year. As such, Mr. Reese asked permission from the Board to purchase gift cards for high school employees as a reward for their hard work and dedication. 75 gift cards will be purchased from Dickies at Swan Lake for \$30 each, totaling \$2,250. Mr. Reese noted that he may be receiving a 20% discount from Swan Lake, which would decrease the purchase price to \$1,800. Bob Borlik made a motion to approve the purchase of (75) \$30 gift cards from Dickies at Swan Lake for \$2,250. Curt Pletcher seconded the motion, and the motion passed with a vote of six to zero.

7. Approve Summer School Cafeteria Staff

Christian Mattix made a motion to approve the Summer School cafeteria staff. Curt Pletcher seconded the motion, and the motion passed with a six to zero vote.

8. Zac Mago Foundation Donation

A short discussion was held before Curt Pletcher made a motion to approve a donation of \$1,500 to the Zac Mago Foundation in support of heart testing for student athletes. Christian Mattix seconded the motion, and the motion passed with a vote of six to zero.
