School Board Meeting – October 15, 2019 Regular & Executive Session

CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL - 7:00 P.M.

ESTABLISH A QUORUM AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The Board of School Trustees of the John Glenn School Corporation met in regular session at 7:00 p.m. on October 15, 2019, at the John Glenn Administration Office. Board members present were Jeff Johnson, Bill Groves, Dan Drotar, Bob Borlik and Dennis Holland. Christian Mattix and Curt Pletcher were absent. Christopher Winchell, Superintendent, and 12 observers were also present.

Bill Groves made a motion to approve Consent Agenda Items one through four and Bob Borlik seconded the motion. The motion passed with a five to zero vote.

NEW BUSINESS

1. Public Meeting to review Master Teacher Contract 2019 - 2020

As a result of recent legislation (Senate Bill 390 – 2019), the School Board must hold a public meeting and discussion about the tentative Teacher Collective Bargaining Agreement. The meeting was opened to public discussion at 7:13 p.m. A tentative agreement has been reached between the Teacher's Association and the School Corporation. Mr. Chris Winchell shared information concerning changes to the Master Teacher Contract. Some minor changes in contract language will be made and \$2,300 will be added to the base salary of all teachers. Discussion was held during which Board members asked Mr. Winchell questions about the bargaining process. Education Association Co-President, Mr. Pat Crone, noted that the Association appreciated the mutual respect shown during the "well-done" process. The discussion was closed at 7:32 p.m.

- 2. Adopt Resolution to Approve 2020 Budget as advertised
 - a. Education Fund
 - b. Debt Service Fund
 - c. Retirement/Severance Bond Fund
 - d. Operations Fund
 - e. Rainy Day Fund

Board President, Dennis Holland, listed all five funds of the 2020 Budget to be approved. Mr. Tom Bendy, Treasurer, reminded all present of the key points of the budget, to include an advertised tax rate of 1.4551 and a requested levy of \$5.383 million. Mr. Bendy noted that the following Resolutions to Approve the Capital Projects Plan (New Business #3) and Bus Replacement Plan (New Business #4) are also a part of the budget approval process. Those items have been properly advertised per Indiana Code. A short discussion was held where Mr. Winchell noted that this was the culmination of budget work since July 1st. All statutory requirements have been tended to and no public concern has surfaced. Thus, Mr. Winchell recommended the approval of the Board. Bill Groves made a motion to adopt the Resolution to approve the 2020 Budget as advertised. Jeff Johnson seconded the motion, and the motion passed with a five to zero vote.

3. Adopt Resolution to Approve 2020 Capital Projects Plan

Bill Groves made a motion to adopt the Resolution to Approve the 2020 Capital Projects Plan. Jeff Johnson seconded the motion, and the motion passed with a five to zero vote.

4. Adopt Resolution to Approve 2020 Bus Replacement Plan

Jeff Johnson made a motion to adopt the Resolution to Approve the 2020 Bus Replacement Plan. Bob Borlik seconded the motion, and the motion passed with a five to zero vote.

5. Additional Appropriation Hearing

The School Corporation is funding building repairs through the issuance of general obligation bonds. The proceeds from this bond issue must be appropriated prior to being spent on projects. This is additional money than what was officially approved in the 2019 budget process last year. As a result, a public hearing was needed. Notice of this hearing was advertised in the South Bend Tribune and Plymouth Pilot on September 24, 2019. The hearing was opened to public comment at 7:39 p.m. No comments were voiced and the hearing was closed at 7:40 p.m.

6. Adopt Additional Appropriation Resolution (Exhibit A)

Mr. Chris Winchell, Superintendent, stated that this resolution, along with the Final Bond Resolution (New Business #7) and the Post Issuance Procedures Resolution (New Business #8) are part of the general obligation bond issuance procedure. This is the Board's official action to amend the previously approved budget after public comment was allowed. Bill Groves made a motion to adopt the additional appropriation resolution and Jeff Johnson seconded the motion. The motion passed with a vote of five to zero.

7. Adopt Final Bond Resolution (Exhibit B)

This resolution asserts that it is the Corporation's intent to sell bonds before the end of the calendar year, not to exceed \$1.9 million. Bill Groves made a motion to adopt the Final Bond Resolution and Bob Borlik seconded the motion. The motion passed with a five to zero vote.

8. Adopt Resolution Approving Amended Post Issuance Procedures (Exhibit C)

This resolution gives limited authority to Mr. Chris Winchell, Mr. Tom Bendy, ICE Miller, and/or Mr. Bill Kaminsky to correct minor items that may surface post bond issuance. Bill Groves made a motion to adopt the Resolution Approving Amended Post Issuance Procedures. Jeff Johnson seconded the motion, and the motion passed with a five to zero vote.

REPORTS

1. Superintendent's Report

Mr. Chris Winchell, Superintendent, shared highlights from the recent 21st Century Scholars Workshop he attended with Mrs. Melanie Heiser and Mrs. Stephanie Reynolds. Mr. Winchell noted that the Corporation's goal is to increase student enrollment in the program as well as encourage students to pursue college enrollment.

Mr. Winchell next discussed a security issue that was recently dealt with at the high school. Mr. Winchell stated a letter was sent out to parents advising them of the issue and resolution of the issue. Mr. Winchell reassured board members and patrons in attendance that student security is always the number one priority at John Glenn School Corporation.
