## The Swoop Scoop

"Swoop" is a nickname for our Title I Program. Students in grades K-4 may qualify for extra reading support each semester thanks to a federally funded program for which JGSC qualifies. Currently, our Swoop Groups service over 120 of our NLES Shamrocks in grades kindergarten through grade 4. Monday through Thursday, the students work in consistent small groups with reading lessons led by an instructional aide. Mrs. Weiss, Title I teacher, alternates between groups in order to work with each student several times throughout the semester.

## Small Group Spotlight:

1st Graders in Mrs. Craft's Group are working on consonant clusters and digraphs and using those to decode unfamiliar words. They really enjoyed their recent book where Bunny was afraid of a storm, but forced himself to be brave. They enjoyed making "thunder" sounds and reading with expression in that book.


1st Graders in Mr. Hadden's Group have been doing a great job detecting consonant sounds in
 consonant clusters and how they change. This group read The Gingerbread Man as both a book, and then entertained themselves by reading the play, too.

1st Graders in Ms. Kaser's Group are also practicing reading with expression. They read a version of Goldilocks and the Three Bears. The group then used puppets for their reading of the play. Goldilocks and the 3 Bears has never been better!


1st Graders in Ms. Zoellner's Group are working on an important comprehension skill--making connections. The students do "book walks" where they discuss what the book will be about. They access previous information (what they already know). After reading, they make additional connections by thinking further. "I wonder $\cdot$." The students loved the book Trucks!

Along with the small groups, our Swoop Crew is in the midst of IditaREAD! This is our school's reading twist on the Alaskan Sled Team Race called Iditarod. All students and staff are reading to
 earn sled dogs to help our teams reach the finish line. How does your child earn a dog? Reading, of course! Each student has an individual (obtainable!) goal set by his or her teacher. Every class is rooting for specific mushers, too!
